

Short term and temporary building supplies

Information: a new water connection that will be used during your project and then converted to your water supply is a short term building supply. A new water connection that is used during your project but not converted to your water supply is a temporary building supply which will then be disconnected.

1. Type of connection

The duty to make a water connection under Section 45 and the domestic supply duty under Section 52 of the Water Act 1991 only applies to a supply of water to be used for domestic purposes (defined in Section 218). For example drinking, washing, cooking, central heating, sanitary and certain other purposes outside a house carried out in respect of the occupation of the house.

Water used for building purposes, carried out as part of a building project would be subject to Section 55 and subject to agreement between Anglian Water and the owner/occupier of the premises.

2. Short term building supplies

Building supplies that will become domestic supplies:

- Where a wall box is to be used we will install a metered boundary box as near as possible to the boundary of
 the property. A temporary connection to the standpipe/temporary site welfare facilities will be made following
 inspection of the pipework by Anglian Water. When the standpipe/temporary site welfare facility is no longer
 required, we will connect through to the wall box and transfer the meter from the boundary box to the wall box.
- Where the boundary box will be the permanent meter location, following pipework inspection, we will connect
 to the standpipe/temporary welfare facilities. We will make a further inspection of the pipework when you
 are ready to abandon the standpipe/temporary site welfare facilities and connect through to the premises.

3. Temporary building supplies

We will install a metered boundary box to supply the standpipe/temporary welfare facilities, which will be disconnected when no longer required.

When you are ready for the temporary supply to be disconnected you will need to inform your retailer.

4. Requirements

Pipework must be a minimum of 750mm deep with a capped tail pipe clearly visible in order for Anglian Water to connect the supply.

Standpipes must include double check valves and must be boxed and lagged in accordance with the Water Supply (Water Fittings) Regulations 1999.

If the supply is to serve temporary site welfare facilities it is important that any plumbing within these facilities are in accordance with the Water Supply (Water Fittings) Regulations 1999.
